QUILTING PATTERNS ON-LINE

Many quilting designs may be found at www.quiltmaker.com/motifs If you scroll down towards the bottom of the page under Finishing Touches there is a heading for continuous designs. Clicking on continuous designs will take you to the first of eight pages of quilting designs. Take a look and get inspiration for quilting you quilt.

DIY ROUND ROBIN QUILT CHALLENGE

This one is going to be lots of fun with a combination of activities - it'll be a round robin but not in the traditional sense, this is one that's considered DIY (Do It Yourself). It's also a mystery, and it's also a challenge! We've created a Round Robin for you with a twist -- a DIY Round Robin –each round is constructed by you! It's a great opportunity to start the New Year off clearing out some of that stash so you can add more to it throughout the year!

Each round will have guidelines on design and size, but how you arrange them will be up to you.

Starting round is the center of your DIY RR. A 12" finished/12 ½" unfinished center. It can be one large design either pieced or appliqued or a series of blocks to create your 12" center. If you are short of time and want to make this quilt the center can even be a 12" of a large print fabric.


There will be at least 5 rounds in this DIY RR. We hope many of you take up the challenge and have these quilts finished in time for the show in September.


BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Blocks are 12" finished or 12 ½" with seam allowance. You may use any color you wish. Patterns may be seen at www.quilterscache.com and are used with permission. Bring one or more blocks to the meeting to be in the drawing for all the blocks submitted.

JANUARY BLOCK OF THE MONTH- SNOWBALL


** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block ** Color 1 needs: one $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square of four prints Color 2 needs one $2\frac{1}{2}$ " by width of fabric strip cut into sixteen $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares





Lay a Color 2 2 1/2" square atop the top left corner of the first calico 6 1/2" square, right sides together and edges aligned. On the back of the top small square, lightly draw the diagonal in the direction shown at left. Sew on this marked line. Cut off the excess seam allowance, and press the remainder towards the center square. Repeat with another

square on the opposing corner, and then with the two remaining corners with seams going in the other direction, pressing the last two additions towards the outer triangle...



Now piece the four "snowballs" to make the Block! Simple!!

FEBRUARY BLOCK OF THE MONTH - RIBBON QUILT BLOCK


Color 1 (dark) needs: two 4-7/8" squares Color 2 (dark) needs: two 4-7/8" squares

Color 3 (light) needs: two 4-7/8" squares AND one 4-1/2" square

Color 4 (light) needs: two 4-7/8" squares

** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **





Place a Color 4 and a Color 1 4-7/8" square right sides together and all edges aligned. On the back of the top square draw in the diagonal. Sew a scant 1/4" away from the drawn line on each side. Cut apart on the drawn line. This will gave you two half squares. Press to the darker side. Trim these back to measure 4-1/2" if needed. Repeat this with a Color 4/Color 2 set, and Color 3/Color 1 set and a Color

3/Color 2 set to get two each in

that color arrangement...

Now just lay out all your pieces, using the extra Color 3 4-1/2" square as the block's center. Sew three horizontal rows, pressing seams in the top and bottom rows to the outside, and the middle row seams to the center...and you are DONE!...with ONE.
