COOKIE RECIPE Here is the recipe for the cookies Judy Verzino baked for the last guild meeting.

Coconut Macaroons

2 eggs whites

1/2 tsp vanilla

2/3 C sugar

1 31/2 oz can or 1 1/3 C flaked coconut

Beat egg whites with a dash salt and the vanilla till soft peaks form. Gradually add sugar, beating till stiff. Fold in coconut. Drop by rounded teaspoons onto greased cookie sheet. Bake in oven (325) about 20 minutes. Makes about 18 cookies. I like to use parchment paper on the cookie sheet. The cookies brown evenly. From Better Homes and Garden new Cook Book.

there are photos of crazy quilt blocks as well as directions on how to do the various embroidery stitches and diagrams of several rows of stitches done together to make a pattern.

If you go to http://www.caron-net.com and click on classes you will find a free crazy quilt class that has pictures of how to piece the fabric to the muslin background as well as information about crazy quilt stitches.

FEBRUARY BLOCK OF THE MONTH - RIBBON QUILT BLOCK


Color 1 (dark) needs: two 4-7/8" squares Color 2 (dark) needs: two 4-7/8" squares

Color 3 (light) needs: two 4-7/8" squares AND one

4-1/2" square

Color 4 (light) needs: two 4-7/8" squares

** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **
Place a Color 4 and a Color 1 4-7/8" square right
sides together and all edges aligned. On the back of
the top square draw in the diagonal. Sew a scant 1/4"
away from the drawn line on each side. Cut apart on
the drawn line. This will gave you two half squares.
Press to the darker side. Trim these back to measure
4-1/2" if needed. Repeat this with a Color 4/Color 2
set, and Color 3/Color 1 set and a Color 3/Color 2 set
to get two each in that color arrangement...



Now just lay out all your pieces, using the

extra Color 3 4-1/2" square as the block's center. Sew three horizontal rows, pressing seams in the top and bottom rows to the outside, and the middle row seams to the center...and you are DONE!...with ONE.





MARCH BLOCK OF THE MONTH STARFLOWER

Color 1 (dark) needs: two strips 3-7/8" x 7-3/4" Color 2 (medium) needs: two strips 3-7/8" x 7-3/4" Color 3 (light background) needs: one strip 3-1/2" x 14" AND two strips 3-7/8" x 7-3/4"

Start by cutting the Color 3 3-1/2" x 14" strip into four 3-1/2" squares...



Then speed piece the half squares...by stacking the Color 3 and Color 1...Color 2 and Color 3...and Color 2 and Color 1 3-7/8" x 7-3/4" strips, right sides together and all edges aligned. On the backs of the top strips, lightly mark off the 3-7/8" square lines, and then mark the diagonals in the direction shown at left...Now sew a scant 1/4" above the marked diagonals in one continuous seam from the upper left corners to the upper right corners...pivoting at the 3-7/8" square lines...then turn the fabrics, and sew back a scant 1/4" on the other side of the marked diagonals...cut apart on the square lines, and on the marked diagonals...this will give you four of each color combo of half squares....press seam allowances towards the darker fabrics...

Now you can piece the block, by first making rows, and then sewing the rows together to make the block! Alternate pressing directions by row.



Makes a 12" (12 1/2" unfinished) block.
