

Machine Quilting—What to Expect?

You've finished piecing your quilt and you've decided to have it machine quilted. You have a list of machine quilters, how do you decide which machine quilter to send it to?


Discuss machine quilting with people who have had their quilts machine quilted to figure out which one(s) they have used and liked. Get all the information, both good and bad, since it is your responsibility to be an informed consumer.

Here are a few questions to be sure to ask before you hand over your treasure:

- 1) What is the lead time? This can be 6 months to a year so if you need the finished quilt for a specific date you will need to plan ahead.
- 2) Do you sell batting or should I bring my own? Often a machine quilter would rather use a batting shoprefers to work with or she may request a certain brand of batting.
- 3) How much larger than my quilt top should mybacking fabric be? Because of the way a quilt in mounted to a quilting machines rollers, it is necessary to have the backing fabric larger than the quilt top.
- 4) How do you price your work? This is usually "per square inch", but may be square foot, square yard, quilt size or by the hour.
- 5) What kind of quilting will be done? Custom or all over. Be sure you know up front.
- 6) Will I receive an estimate? Be sure you have an estimate
- 7) Do you require a deposit? Is the machine quilter purchasing batting and/or backing fabric? If so, a deposit may be appropriate.
- 8) If extra work is required, do you call in advance of doing that work? Be sure that you will be called before any additional work is done and that you get an estimate for the additional costs.
- 9) Do you baste all the edges? This will help you know what you will see when you pick up your quilt.
- 10) Do you trim the backing and backing? This is your preference, but you should know up front.

Know what to expect up front and both of you will have a better relationship.
