October Guild Meeting — Sew-a-Thon, October 28, 2008

Come to the White Rock Baptist Church for the annual sew-a-thon. Bring your strip sets or bring 2½ inch strips (half dark, half light) and work with a team to make this year's sew-a-thon quilt. Teams of 2 or 3 people can work together: 1 sewer (bring your machine), 1 cutter (bring your cutting tools) and 1 presser (bring your iron or share ones that will be set up there). You will work together to complete a quilt top for a community service quilt.



Don't have a team, come anyway. There will be room on a team or others to put together a team. We always have a lot of fun and it's a great opportunity to work with other quilters and see their techniques in sewing, pressing and cutting. The guild will have batting to use with your quilt top to finish your quilt.

Quilt Tour of Japan January 15 – 26, 2009

- Leave ABQ Jan. 15th and arrive in Tokyo Jan. 16th Spend 3 days at the Tokyo International Great Quilt Festival
- Jan 19th take the bullet train to Kyoto, stay at a Japanese Inn, visit Nijo Castle, Nishijin Weaving Center, Toji Flea Market, Kiyomizu Temple, Kiyomizu Pottery, Indigo Studio, and Japanese Quilt Artist Yoshiko Jinzenji
- Jan 23rd, leave Kyoto to the Tango area famous for Tango Chirimen Silk. Visit the Dyeing Center, Silk Historical Museum, Silk Trail, and sight seeing at Yosan o-cho.
- Jan 24th to Atami famous for the Hot Springs.
- Jan 25th on to Shinagawa Tokyo for a free afternoon.
- Jan 26th leave Japan for the return trip home.

Cost: \$4,638 (double occ.) includes tax, round trip airfare from ABQ, accommodations, transportation, entrance fee for International Great Quilt Festival, all breakfasts, dinner on Jan 24th and English speaking tour coordinator. Less \$1,510 w/out airfare. Additional \$600 for single room.


