September 28, 2012 (prior to Quilt Market): Checking account balance - \$6666.55 Cash on hand (for market) - \$405.

First a huge thanks to all who helped with the checkout process and Joan Williams and Fran Suchocki for their work in the back room with the inventory sheets. It made it possible for us to finish the sales accounting and get the checks out quickly.

Unaccounted items - 3 with a total value of \$61.50. This is 0.1% of the items and the value of the goods for sale. Such a small rate is a testament to the hard and accurate work of the baggers and cashiers.

I expect there will be a few more bills coming in before the final accounting can be completed.

Jemez Bear Paws sold 248 items for \$4,965.96, contributing \$701.77 to LAP profits. Donations from Janette Wallace's family contributed \$386 to LAP. Donations from JT (Check with Susan on who this was) contributed \$55.

Donation Quilt – Profits to-date - \$556. Silent Auction – Collecting proceeds from bidders.

A few words from the Quilt Market Chair...




