HOUSE OF HOPE

This fall the House of Hope women will be going to Juarez, Mexico for the 9th year in a row to build a house for an impoverished family. Magali Zuniga (fromJuarez) is a passionate woman who helps with our work there. She has a number of ministries to women, children and families. One of her ministries is Mujeres con Pasión (Women with Passion). In this ministry Magali's aim is to teach the women basic skills so that they are better able to take care of their families. One of the skills that Magali teaches them is quilt making. The women make one quilt for themselves, one quilt for the project to sell to buy supplies, and one that they give away. The give-away quilt often goes to emergency room patients who must wait outside in all kinds of weather before they receive medical care. The House of Hope women are gathering supplies to take with us on our Columbus Day build (October 10-14). Magali and Mujeres con Pasión can use quilting material and other quilting supplies including sewing machines. You can bring donations to the August and September guild meetings. Last year Piecemakers donated over 11 pounds of fabric. Micki Taylor has also donated several bags of quilt pieces. Magali, Mujeres con Pasión and House of Hope women send many thanks for all your support. New skills have been learned and many quilts have been made with your donations.
