The Meeting was held on October 25, at the White Rock Presbyterian Church. Sharon Kapple, representing Laura, opened the meeting

As membership chair, Sharon reminded us that the 2017 membership forms are available and that we could sign up now.

Library - Deb McLin has brought some library books and several videos. They were purchased with money from selling books at quilt market.

Community Service – Flo Carr told us about a teacher at the High School, Ms. Jones, who has asked for any extra fleece we might have (at least 1½ yard piece) to give to the class. The group is making blankets to donate to a homeless shelter. The teacher is also looking for guild members who might want to talk to a class about quilting.

We then had "Show and Tell" which included a prized antique quilt that Trish Spellman had bought. She and Marilyn Minshall had worked on wool appliqued birds which they also showed.

Sharon passed out the pattern and fabric for the community service quilts and we all began sewing, pressing and cutting.

While sewing Marion Good passed out raffle tickets and gave out several door prizes.

We picked up our areas and left by 9:00 p.m. Some borrowing flash lights when needed.

# Treasurer's Report - Donna Smith

The LANB checking account balance on November 1, 2016 was \$19,184.18. Not all checks from Market have cleared.

We have closed the Merchant Account at LANB for processing credit cards and opened a Square account. The reader has been tested and deposits run into the checking account.

We will vote at the November meeting on accepting credit cards for memberships and workshop fees. The cost for these transactions to LAP would be 2.75 percent.




