They were unanimously voted in.

Next order of business was the budget. Donna had some copies available and it was sent to membership. After a short discussion it was unanimously passed.

New Business:

Sharon is looking for help with the ugly fabric quilt. Also, said we would do the scavenger hunt after the speaker.

Deborah Kubicek suggested we continue the market and show every other year as we are opposite the Santa Fe show. There was more discussion, but no decision and no volunteer to head the quilt show.

Deb McLin spoke of the Fiber Fiesta in Santa Fe at the Scottish Rite Temple coming up Dec. 18th – 20th.

Donna Smith discussed using the "Square". This is a system for accepting credit cards. It will replace the system we have been using from LANB. It has a fee of 2.75%. We will use it for purchases at market, but do we want to accept credit card for dues and workshops? The vote was passed to try it for a year and then review.

From Libby—there are freebies on the table, books-magazines-etc. Please take what you would like.

There are cupcakes to celebrate the guilds birthday. Please get one at the break.

Library—There are books and some DVDs on the table.

After a short break Laura introduced our speaker for the evening—Cindy Barfield. Cindy has been a quilter for 18 years. She works for Santa Fe Quilting where she loves finding out about all of the wonderful gadgets that are coming out for quilters. Cindy started as a hand quilter which she still enjoys, but doesn't have enough time to do it as much anymore. She tries to keep her studio organized. She has learned to throw away unfinished class projects. She suggested that when you start a project you fill out a sheet to put with the project. It should include info about the project-pattern, size, how to finish, who it is being made for, etc. This way it can be finished by someone else if you don't finish it yourself.

Cindy said that she is the notions manager at the quilt store. She brought lots of notions and gadgets with her, including a stand that holds zip lock bags so you can fill it with roasted green chili. She also had Frixion pens, mini washers to set in your bobbin case, a quick ripper, wonder clips, a short cut binding tool, and a small fan to put near your sewing machine. She also brought some quilt samples and patterns. She suggested we stop by the quilt store to look at the books they have. She had several books with her—365 Motion Quilting, Simply Stitched, Quilted Bags and Gifts, 138 Original Applique Designs. And rulers and sewing machine feet.

Cindy felt both the quilt stores and quilt guilds are very important to us quilters and we should support them as much as we can.

After Cindy finished her talk she invited us to go up to the front and look at the items she had brought. Sharon invited the members who had done the scavenger hunt to bring their items to the back of the room and they went through the list of items. Some of the participants were very creative in the items they submitted. On the list the item "spool art" was entered—a wooden spool with the name "ART" painted across it. Another was listed as a wine bottle with a quilt label—was a wine bottle with a quilted cozy made to fit the bottle. Donna Smith and Linda Kolar had the most items and won first place. Micki Taylor won third place and Flo Carr won fourth place. Congratulations to everyone who participated.
