Minutes from LAP Guild Meeting 2/28/17 at the United Church of Los Alamos:
Sharon Kapple opened the meeting explaining we would start with a short meeting and then go to our guest speaker Shannon Brinkley.
Community Service-Flo showed donation quilts from Donna Smith and Micki Taylor.
Publicity-Nothing
Quilt Show-still no volunteer
Library-Deb said there are some new books and she still has budget to buy more. Let her know if you have any you would like. She brought some DVDs to the meeting. She will also take donations of books, if they are in new condition and relevant.
Web-Deborah said the server has had some problems that should now be fixed. Let her know if you have a problem receiving the newsletter.

Vice President-Sharon asked for an iron that does not work. One will be donated. She also said the April meeting will be working with paint sticks. She and Erin are working on programs for next year. Show and Tell-

Charlene showed a rail fence quilt she had finished.

Bev showed a quilt top of a donation quilt

Shelley showed a mini atomic quilt she had received from a person in Australia. She had participated in an on-line quilt swap.

Door prizes were drawn.

Followed with a presentation by Shannon Brinkley, author of "Scrappy Bits Applique."

She started sewing clothes when she was young. Then got interested in quilting while she was in college. When she went to the Houston quilt show she was hooked. Her technique has been raw edge applique. In 2016 she published a book on raw edge applique and also has a fabric line.

She explained her process, starting with building the collage using a light weight fusable interfacing (her preference is to use Pellon 906F) on the back of scrap fabrics. She warned that you needed to be sure to protect your iron and ironing board when adding the fusable by making a parchment paper sandwich. The scraps can be whatever shape you decide. Then add these scraps to your shape that you've drawn on your fabric. Cut out the shape and fuse it to your background-which can be a solid piece of fabric or a background that you have pieced together. She then did top stitching on the piece(usually with clear thread) with several different options depending on the size, use, and amount of detail in the design. She would then sandwich and quilt.

We then got to see many of her beautiful quilts. There were collages of animals, trees, leafs, birds and cityscapes. You can see more at: <u>http://shannon-brinkley.com/</u>
