
White Rock Presbyterian Church Tuesday, May 24 at 7:00 p.m.

Los Alamos Piecemakers Quilt Guild April 26, 2022 Secretary Report - Deb McLin

Linda K. called the meeting to order at 7:10 pm.

Welcome to new members/visitors: The guild welcomed new member and new quilter Kathy originally from Texas.

## Officer Reports

Vice President – Because of the evacuation of SLP, Donna Smith and Brenda Edeskuty could not attend tonight so there is a postponing of the Treasurer's report and Brenda's report on Market.

Secretary- Deb McLin states that there are no changes to March minutes.

## Committee Reports:

Community Service- Flo said that we are OK on charity quilts but could always use more especially if there is a "call for quilts" for fire victims.

Membership- Clara mentioned that we have many names on our membership list that have passed away or have moved. Linda suggested that we have a board meeting and go over the list and remove those we know are no longer able to be members. Deb mentioned that in past years (far past) names were removed if dues weren't paid by a certain month and they were also removed from the newsletter list. Linda said that this would be discussed at the board meeting.

Publicity- Joan said that no updates in LA Daily Post so no mention of our meetings.

Webmaster- Deborah K. no report but Linda was hoping she would give us some instruction on how to post pictures on our LAP facebook page.

UFO Challenge- We will try to get it started again soon so any projects you have already finished and given away or will give away before November please take a picture for our challenge.

Program- Shelly introduced Kay Sutt who is one of the regional representatives of Studio Art Quilt Associates. (SAQA) in northern New Mexico. Kay says there are over 4000 members worldwide representing all continents. There are 78 member at this time in NM. She has brought us 40 small 7 by 10 mounted art quilts as a trunk show. These art pieces are submitted every four years and then travel for 4 years. This gives exposure to the fiber art that SAQA members create and is used to recruit new members. Our trunk show contained submissions from members around the world. The bio of the artist and the technique used as well as the title gave the viewer an idea of the inspiration of the piece.

The art pieces used beading and patchwork. Some artists painted fabric and others used hand dyed fabric. All of the pieces Kay showed were unique and very interesting. Kay Sutt has a business card and can be reached at <a href="mailto:kaysutt.saqa@gmail.com">kaysutt.saqa@gmail.com</a>

She mentioned that the international website is free to non-members with more information becoming available from the website if you become a member.

Deb picked up some of the literature and membership form if anyone is interested.

Vice President Shelly mentioned that there were two spots left for the upcoming May 25 workshop with Julia Goen. She will be presenting "Landscape Quilts". Book is available at Atomic Quilts. There is a \$10 fee for this workshop and any extra donation is appreciated. The workshop will be at the United Church from 9-12. Supply lists are given out at time of registration.

The program and workshop for June 28-29 will be presented by Michelle Watts. Program titled "How does it get from idea to quilt". Her workshop titled "It's simple with stencils" will be held Wednesday at the United Church from 9-3. Cost for members is \$45.00 and non-members \$55.00.

Show and Tell- Linda would like permission to post pictures of the Show and Tell from our meetings on the LAP facebook page. If you do not want your projects posted let us know and we will not post.

Linda Kolar showed an amazing cross stitch UFO of a Christmas Scene with a wonderful french braid fabric border.

Laura E. presented four small wall hangings. One was made for her daughter with an owl motif and she finished her Round Robin of quilt borders using many bright fabrics. She also created a wall hanging for a family member with a nautical theme in applique with beads and buttons called "A Day at the Beach". Cute turtle buttons for sure.

Micki updated the efforts for quilts for Ukraine. 100 squares of yellow and blue blocks and four quilt tops were created to be shipped to Germany where they will be quilted and distributed to children in refugee camps.

Charlene mentioned the exhibit at The Fuller Lodge Art Center titled "Four Common Corners". Nicole Dunn has four wonderful pieces in that show which runs until May 30. It is a fabulous show and very inspiring.

Other items mentioned have already taken place. The Spring Arts and Crafts Fair, May7 and Opera fabric give away on May 12.

Meeting adjourned around 8:30 pm.
