Officer Report

Vice President- Shelly reminded the members that there were still sign up slots for the destash sale. Volunteers were needed for morning 9-12:30 and afternoon 12:00-3:30.

Brenda reminded members that the de-stash sale was Saturday, July 30 at the United Church. We will be selling donated high quality fabric for \$10.00 a bag. Also the library books will be sold and members may set up a table and sell their own items.

Shelly promoted a new swap starting in October. It will be patterned after the game "telephone". You will submit a photo to another quilter. They will interpret it in a 12 inch quilted block. Then that block will be the inspiration for the next quilter to make a 12 inch quilted block without seeing the photo. After several rounds the original photo and the quilted blocks will be shown to the members to see how the different interpretations were presented in the different blocks.

Brenda reminded us that Jeni Kay Parks will be our speaker in August in White Rock. She is a instructor, designer and speaker. Her presentation titled, "Every Quilt is a Learning Quilt." will also include a trunk show. On Wednesday from 9-4 at the United Church she will present a workshop titled "Dangerous Curves". It will be a demo and practice experience on how to piece fabric without pins while curve piecing.

In September Debby Maddy will talk about Shibori dyeing techniques as well as her experiences as a world traveler and being an apprentice with top teachers. Her workshop on Wednesday, September 28 will focus on Shibori design and hand dyeing.

All workshops in 2022 are still \$45.00 for members and \$55.00 for non-members.

In October we will have our Potluck and in November we will have a sew-a-thon to resupply our charity quilts.

Looking forward to 2023 we will schedule a speaker and workshop to introduce English Paper Piecing.

Treasurer's report - Donna reassures us that we are still in the black financially.

#### Committee reports

Community Service- Flo reported that we received six quilts and more were turned in tonight.

Membership- Clara reminded everyone to send in their dues. 2023 dues will be \$35.00 and workshops will increase to \$55.00 for members and \$65.00 for non-members.

Newsletter- Laura reminded members that they can submit articles or any announcements to the newsletter.

Publicity-Joan was happy with the media outlets response for announcing our activities.

UFO Challenge-Joan reminded the members that we will have a UFO Challenge contest again this year so give her a dollar for every quilting project you guess you will finish by our last meeting. Bring them for show and tell or a photo of the quilt. There will be a drawing and the winner gets the money. So far there has been little interest in the challenge.

Program- Speaker Michelle Watts "From Idea to Quilt"

Michelle explained her personal design process. Her process begins with deciding on color but not necessarily in fabric. She likes to include colors found in nature and she does use media such as pintrest to get started on occasion. Her next step is the design element and that usually comes from objects. She uses books and magazines for further research. Michelle will make small sketches and doodles as she comes up with an idea.

She questions how she will put it together. Will she use piecing, stencils or embroidery. She thinks of how the blocks will be organized by drawing on graph paper using pencils.

When designing patterns she will make the quilt from her written instructions and then after proofing the narrative she will have someone else make the quilt and then make changes as necessary.

When quilting the final version she likes to use an open zig-zag stitch to add texture. 3.5 width and 3.5 length usually works for her.

Show and Tell

Marian K. brought 2 quilts. Her Wonky Star Round Robin quilt of 2020 and a pineapple quilt using the leftover stars.

Laura brought a collection found while cleaning out a family home. She showed a quilt that may have belonged to her father. It had sailboat blocks and was well loved. She also showed two Grandmother's Flower Garden quilts and a fan block quilt.

#### Additional Items

Jemez Springs Bear Paws Guild Show is July 22-24 at the Madonna Hall in Jemez Springs. They will have many items for sale as well as raffle tickets for several quilts.
