Vice President-Brenda announced that the July workshop with Holly from Sew Together has been cancelled. The August LAP meeting will host Donna Felker from the Bear Paws quilt group in the Jemez Springs area. She will moderate the presentation of the quilts from their 2023 BOM.

In September, Liz Martineau will present a program called "Fabric Books". She asks any one who has made fabric books to bring them to the meeting. In October we will have our annual pot-luck and hopefully the election of new board members. November will be the sew-a-thon and Show and Tell event for the UFO raffle.

Committee Reports

Community Service- Melodie and Flo gave 15 quilts to the fire victims of Ruidoso. So the cupboard needs to be restocked. Linda reports that 49 placemats have been made with the goal being 80. Please bring your placemats to the August meeting as Linda would like to present them to the Senior Center in September.

Newsletter-Joan has received feedback from members of not receiving the newsletter in their e-mail box. The newsletter is published on the LAP webpage several days before the meeting. Also the dates and time and place are always posted at the beginning of the year on the webpage. Mark your calendars accordingly so you don't miss out.

Publicity-Abbey has begun to distribute LAP flyers to promote the guild programs. She would appreciate any ideas to fuller publicize the guild activities.

UFO-Joan has the sign up sheet and money bag. A photo or actual item will be needed for the annual raffle at the November meeting. There is still time to add your name and dollars for every UFO you think you will finish in 2024.

Micki reports that an overflowing car of quilting supplies was delivered to Lola and Tanya in Gallup NM. They are Dine' quilters who will share the supplies with other quilters on the reservation. The women asked Micki to express their heartfelt thanks to Lap quilters.

Sunshine Reports- Ann Daley, our LAP member is recovering at home and Linda reminds everyone to stay hydrated and cool during our expected very warm summer.

Show 'n Tell-Linda started us off by showing a paper pieced heart themed wall hanging.

Spring returned to us with a quilt she has been working on for awhile for her son that featured vehicles and a sun block center. It was a few years in the making but her 8 year old still loves it.

Brenda brought a wall hanging of her niece's wedding. It was made with the sublimation technique that Celeste demonstrated for us. This involves scanning and transferring pictures to fabric and then using a special printer and inks. She also pointed out the "facing technique" of finishing the quilt rather than the traditional binding method.

Donna brought out her masterpiece quilt. This is a hand quilted reproduction of an 1802 Baltimore design. It has hand applique design and is a king size. Our program guest, Michael, agreed that the design was authentic to the period and a work of art.

Program- Ann and Michael Siewert of Thread Bear Quilt Shop in Las Cruces were the guests for the quilt meeting. They arranged a pop-up shop for shopping for fabric and Deb Tucker Studio 180 patterns and rulers. Ann is a certified teacher of the Deb Tucker Studio 180 technique of block construction. Ann brought examples of different size blocks using the Tucker Trimmer, Wing Clipper, and Square in a Square rulers. Ann explained the way these blocks can be constructed and trimmed to the size needed using the rulers. She brought a trunk show to display how the blocks can be used in quilts. She will present a workshop tomorrow using the Rapid Fire Lemoyne Star Ruler.
